We have obtained proof that the construction firm, Cardoso & Fills (Luxembourg), carries out illegal covert surveillance on us, most likely on behalf of BNP Paribas and Danske Bank International. This surveillance was discovered by accident, of which is elaborated in a transcript of a conversation between Ms. Baranyi and the police in Cents, Luxembourg.

Please find the transcript attached to this complaint as **Appendix # 1**.

When the police discovered who was behind this surveillance, they immediately shelved our criminal complaint. Hence, the police force as well as the Public Prosecutor, is protecting serious criminal activity in Luxembourg.

In reference to our complaint earlier today asking for immediate interim measures, we have no reason to trust the public prosecutor or the police force. Tomorrow the police force will illegally attempt to enter our house in order to confiscate all our private belongings. Having in regard to what an extent the police force is willing to go in order to protect serious criminal activity, we are seriously afraid of what harm the police force can inflict on us.

We thus ask the Court to immediately carry out any interim measures against Luxembourg, according to Rule 39 of the Rules of the Court, that can protect us against the Luxembourg police force and public prosecutor who obviously are corrupt to the core, please refer to the above mentioned appendix (as well as Complaint I of today) for further elaboration on the said corruption.

We would greatly appreciate your soonest response.

The problem is that if it is true that the technician was to take pictures of the old façade, then he is more than six months late, as they started tearing down half of 655 in early February. There was thus nothing to take pictures of, as the 655 at present already is halfway of getting a new façade.

that was the technician who came on Friday at your house, taking photographs of your house, didn't get out of the car because it was raining, so he came back yesterday, <sup>31</sup> no, not, was it yesterday? Yes, on Monday, because they don't work Saturday and Sunday, so they came back on, what did you say to me? <sup>32</sup> On Monday morning, against eleven, against eleven, around eleven a clock, in the morning, to introduce <sup>33</sup> himself to you, asking you <sup>34</sup> that it's your house to make a new façade. You said to him; no it isn't my house, so he checked out at his office; ok, what house is it, em, call back Decore Painture and they said it's not 665 it's 655, rue de Neudorf, and that's for sure. <sup>35</sup> That's what I did get out, now of everything, and you now tell me what you will do?

- 91. **KB**: No, I just don't, because like when he came yesterday, he was very, very sure, he said; I'm coming here to measure your house.

- 94. **PC**: That's what I said to you, that, the mistake had happened in the office, in Cardoso's office, you know.
- 95. **KB**: but it can't be, there can't, I mean, if you look at it, there can't be mistake. They have been here so many times as they told you on Friday, so, and the house, it's, I mean the house 655 is under construction and nobody, you won't make a miss. You can't miss a residential that people live and a residential that people don't live, because the 655 its really look messy because they're building it, and how on earth that he stop at my house, so
- 96. you understand that the technician got the formula, <sup>37</sup> you know the formula, and there is a number on it,

Ok, I told you on Friday that Mr. Cardoso told me that, that could be<sup>38</sup> there were, ehm, listen, that, ehm, they were months ago where there to take photographs, but Mr. Cardoso himself thought<sup>39</sup> that is was the other house he gonna build in the rue de Neudorf, and not your house. <sup>40</sup> So he told me, ehm, that could be, that we had been there already few months ago, and, you know, for me it's a big, big, big misunderstood, but if you don't believe me<sup>41</sup>, just tell me what we gonna do now, you want to complaints against Mr. Cardoso or not?

- 136. PC: Oh, was it a mistake? Hm? (evil tone)

- 236. **PC**: Like he said to me, normally did they making, they 're doing that at the same time, but he was at the house and he saw<sup>109</sup> that it was raining, and just taking the photographs<sup>110</sup> and decided to come back another day.<sup>111</sup> Ok?

By this statement the officer implies that there is a correlation between the officer's call and the technicians visit. The officer is explaining how the technician is working with his camera and his measure instrument, and that he had a tight schedule, which was the reason – the officer assumed – why he didn't come on Monday, and then the officer explains this with: "Because I hadn't the time to call him on Monday". There is obviously a link between the visit and the phone call.

Here he is trying to take over the power he just lost. Listen to it.

He understands that his cover-up story didn't hold water, and "jumps in front of me" to stop me again, with this. See earlier attempts in paragraph 191.

118 Again, what does this attitude or approach tell us? I am leading this investigation, and he is just put there to tamper my attempts.
