As the police are aware of, 1 notary Francis Kesseler is - although lacking any documentation on default/breach of contract or the alleged non-payment of a house loan which doesn't exist - preparing a forced sale of our home in Luxembourg.

It has been proven as a fact that documents which should support and give legal authority for a forced sale, doesn't exist. In this regard, please find enclosed a copy of our letters to Kesseler of February 14 and February 28 2011 as well as our criminal complaint against Kesseler of March 2 2011, explaining and documenting the matter in details.

Consequently Kesseler is preparing a criminal act against our private property, carried out on instructions from a criminal organization. As Kesseler has refused to give us access to any documents in this matter, and to avoid further crimes and damages, we hereby **PETITION** the public prosecutor to <u>immediately</u> instruct Kesseler to give us and the prosecutor access to all documents of which he claims comprises the legal basis for the imminent foreclosure, or - if Kesseler can not provide the prosecutor and us with these said documents listed in the criminal complaint of March 2 2011 - order the arrest of Kesseler on suspicion of conspiring to commit a crime.

Should the prosecutor render the abovementioned actions as lawful in Luxembourg, we then petition the public prosecutor to – without further due – **refer** this petition, related to the investigation of gross financial cross-border $^2$  crimes, to Eurojust, as a request for assistance.
